Working in partnership with the priests of the parish and using a collaborative approach, its major focus is to identify the potential of its people and to involve them in building up the parish as a faith community.

When do you meet? Once a month, in the Pastoral Centre.

What exactly does your work involve?

In this the establishment phase of the Council, our purposes are:

- \circ to promote a Sense of the Presence of Christ among the people of the parish.
- to acknowledge, celebrate and communicate the existing great work being done by many parish members through the wide variety of parish organizations
- to encourage a Sense of Personal Responsibility for the faith of our parish and facilitate further participation and partnership in sharing the talents of all members of our parish community in the years ahead
- to listen to the community and work to address the developing pastoral and spiritual needs of our parish in the C21st beginning with those identified in the Parish Survey (April 2011)

What is the purpose of your activity in the Parish?

To provide a group of children with a week of fun activities when they can make new friends and grow in self esteem and confidence. Gives Leaders experiences of working as a team and opportunities to develop skills and self confidence while also exploring their spirituality and developing their awareness of issues surrounding social justice.

When do you meet? There are 4 Training Days for Leaders in the Spring. We also meet to prepare for the week of camp, for fundraising events and for a Christmas Party for the children

Where do you meet? Training is held in the Pastoral Centre with the summer camp centred in the CBS Sports Hall.

What exactly does your work involve?

Organising a week long summer camp, (non-residential) for children P4 – P7, involving a wide range of activities – sports, games, treasure hunts, day trips, arts and crafts and more. Activities are led by young adults, 17 -21 years under close supervision of an experienced adult team.

How many are involved in the work of your group? This year we have about 60 young leaders working with 35 children. Numbers are growing each year and the camp may be expanded to provide two separate weeks.

Have you a committee? A National Executive Committee in Dublin headed by Br. Chris Glavey, coordinates all camps. A local Committee is comprised of mentors and coordinators with extensive experience from previous summer camps.
