We live in a society where we are encouraged to put our own needs first. In that way, marriage has come to be seen as disposable and easily ended. For Jesus to teach that marriage comes from God is neither seen nor accepted in a post-Christian society. When there is no horizon of heaven, where only the visible counts, then marriage becomes more about the entitlement to be happy and the avoidance of struggle or suffering. Consequently, the modern view of marriage: namely, it's fine if it works for both parties. It is no longer presumed to be a lifetime commitment. And indeed, when the relationship breaks down, recriminations start. The solicitors get involved and there is the inflicting of further pain through immature behavior. Not only is it a difficult situation for children to grow up in, but it is also a difficult environment that impedes how they might imbibe the level of sacrifice and mutual consideration that will make their own prospective marriages work, if they ever face entering into one. Society is affected and future generations weakened.

Jesus invites us to see marriage through the lens of God's eternal love—a love that endures even through difficulties. This is becoming an alien notion in modern society, or a notion that is easily cast aside when difficulties arise.

St. Teresa of Calcutta: "Love begins at home, and it is not how much we do... but how much love we put in that action."


